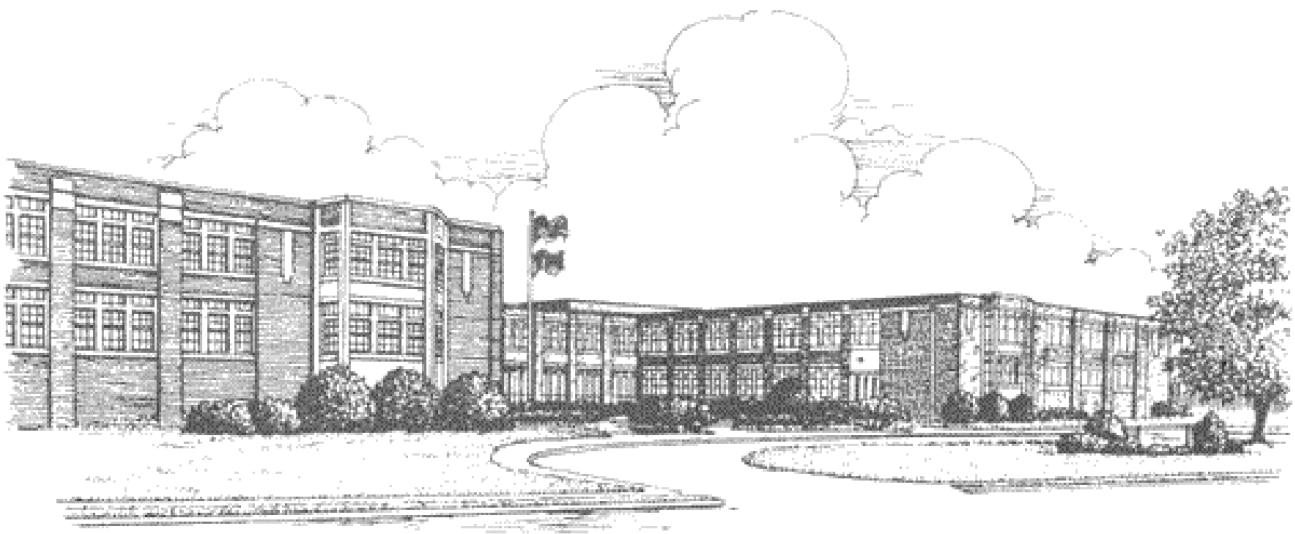

INTRODUCTION

For over 30 years, the Christian Liberty Academy School System has offered its K–12 curriculum to home schooling families on a full grade-level basis. While the full CLASS program is still the best option both academically and financially for most families, we recognize that there may be good reasons why a student may wish to take only a course or two with CLASS. We are pleased to offer our courses on an individual basis. These are the same courses we offer in our standard full-time curriculum, with the same grading, report card, and transcript services. CLASS is simply making these courses available individually to independent home schoolers outside of the full-time CLASS program.

ENROLLMENT PROCEDURE

First, read the sections below so that you will understand how these courses are administered, and what restrictions apply. Next, select the desired course(s) based on the course descriptions. Finally, enroll using one of the following options.

BY MAIL

Complete the enrollment application form, attach payment for the full tuition amount, and mail both to CLASS. Payment by check or money order must be made in U.S. funds and drawn on a U.S. bank, payable to Christian Liberty Academy. Tuition may also be paid by VISA, MasterCard, or Discover card. We do not send C.O.D. or on-approval orders.

If your check fails to clear the bank and is returned for insufficient funds, or for any other reason, we will automatically debit your account \$20.00 to cover our bank's service charge.

BY FAX

You may enroll by FAX at **(847) 259-1297** if you pay by VISA, MasterCard, or Discover card. FAX the completed enrollment form, making sure you include your charge card number, expiration date, amount to be charged to your card, and signature.

RESTRICTIONS

Students taking individual courses with CLASS are not enrolled in our full-time, or diploma, program. You are not eligible to graduate from CLASS or receive a CLASS high school diploma unless you transfer into the full-time program for at least the twelfth grade and meet the same criteria as other transfer students. Credits awarded for individual courses are transferable to our full-time program.

Students taking individual courses are not eligible to request certificates of enrollment. They are also ineligible for eighth grade diplomas.

Tuition must be paid in full at the time of enrollment. Time payment plans are not available for individual courses.

Because the courses are individually priced, we do not allow switching. To change courses, you must cancel the unwanted course and purchase the desired course separately.

The first and second halves of two-year courses are listed separately in the course descriptions. Each half is purchased as a separate course, but the textbook remains the same and therefore will not be shipped again with the second half.

We cannot offer a tuition credit for textbooks you may already own. All materials will be shipped for each individual course.

TRANSFER STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

Students who intend to transfer into the full-time CLASS high school program must meet the minimum entrance requirements listed below. Individual courses taken through CLASS can be combined with other transcripts to meet these minimum requirements.

To enter **10th** grade: **4.0** earned credits¹, which include

- 1 earned credit of English

To enter **11th** grade: **7.5** earned credits, which include

- 2 earned credits of English
- 1 earned credit of math
- 1 earned credit of science
- 1 earned credit of history

To enter **12th** grade: **12.5** earned credits, which include

- 3 earned credits of English
- 1 earned credit of math
- 1 earned credit of science
- 1 earned credit of history
- 1 earned credit of Bible/theology/religion²
- GPA of 2.0 out of 4.0 (C or better)

All transfer students must also show an appropriate achievement level on the California Achievement Test to enter the requested grade level, and must complete a minimum of twenty (20) credits to graduate. We do not accept transfer credits for physical education, health, and driver's education.

¹ One earned credit implies a full year or two full semesters of work.

² Transfer students who lack this requirement may be assigned an additional Bible credit in the 12th grade provided the assignment does not exceed the 7.5 credit limit for the grade level.

COURSE ACCEPTANCE

CLASS will automatically accept successfully completed, individual courses from a student who transfers into the full-time CLASS high school program. Courses from other schools, however, may not be accepted when entering our full-time program if:

- there is a significant gap between a student's skill level (as measured by the CAT) and the credit awarded by the previous school;
- there is evidence that the standards of the previous school fall significantly below CLASS standards.

In these situations, CLASS reserves the right not to recognize credits and/or to require a student to make up credit deficiencies prior to graduation.

CLASS' full-time program does not accept academic credit from physical education, health, and driver's education courses.

COURSE DELIVERY

Individual courses should be delivered within two (2) weeks from the time we receive your order.

SHIPPING

CONTINENTAL U.S.

Your tuition covers our regular shipping method to physical addresses—UPS Ground Service. You may have materials sent to your Post Office Box address by Priority First-Class Mail if you submit an extra \$6 with each student's enrollment. Please clearly identify such payments as applying to Priority Mail.

ALASKA, HAWAII, U.S. TERRITORIES, APO, OR FPO ADDRESSES

Materials are sent by Priority First-Class Mail unless we are instructed otherwise. You must submit an extra \$6 per student with your enrollment.

FOREIGN ADDRESSES

Foreign missionaries and others who have a home base (home office, sponsoring agency, etc.) in the continental U.S. should send us their home base address, contact person, and telephone number upon enrollment. Shipment to that address by UPS Ground Service is covered by your tuition. You must arrange final shipment to your foreign address with your home base.

If CLASS must ship directly to your foreign address, materials are shipped via UPS Express Service. Your tuition for each enrollment covers a pre-determined portion of the shipping costs. You will be billed for the actual shipping costs (which are determined by your location), minus the predetermined portion. Because charges for international mail vary, we will contact you with the actual costs before shipment.

Due to the expense of UPS Express Service, some families may elect to have their materials shipped by another method. Those who wish to do so must fill out and submit a Mail Loss and Damage Waiver Form (contact CLASS if you do not have this form).

CANCELLATION / REFUND POLICY

If you choose to cancel your individual course(s), please call Customer Service promptly. When you call, be sure to record the date and the name of the Customer Service representative with whom you spoke. This call is important, but it does not cancel your enrollment. A signed letter from the family (mailed or faxed) is required before any cancellation is considered official. If CLASS does not receive this written documentation, the cancellation will not be processed and no refund will be sent.

You have thirty (30) days from the shipping date to cancel your course(s) and request a refund. If you decide to cancel after you have received your materials, call Customer Service and request a Cancellation Kit. This kit contains a Cancellation Letter/Returned Materials Authorization which, when completed and returned to us, serves as your official cancellation letter. The kit also includes a Returned Materials shipping label which must be affixed to the outside of the package you return.

You must return all unused materials to CLASS. If a book has been damaged or has any writing in it, even just a student's name, it is considered used and should not be returned. Christian Liberty is the final arbiter of whether a course item is considered used. Returned materials that are considered by CLASS to be used cannot be sent back to the family. Do not return any materials to CLASS before you receive the Cancellation Kit. You may keep the Individual Course Handbook.

If you cancel before we ship your course materials, a 10% processing fee will be deducted from your refund. If you cancel after your materials are shipped, a 20% processing and restocking fee will be deducted from your refund. There is no refund if you cancel more than thirty (30) days after the shipping date.

19540 Studying God's Word: Book E Grade 4 \$107.00
(Bible: A chronological approach from Genesis to Ruth)

The first in a series of four workbooks, this course begins the chronological approach of the *Studying God's Word* series. This approach includes the highlighting of eleven historical Old Testament and five New Testament books with a view to forming a broad picture of God's works and words in the minds of the student. This particular volume covers select stories from Genesis through Ruth in forty-two lessons. The text contains required in-book exercises; including three in-book tests and map activities, as well as Bible book outlines and chronological charts. Scripture memory work is optional but encouraged. The workbook and teacher's manual are published by Christian Liberty Press. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis.

19550 Studying God's Word: Book F Grade 5 \$107.00
(Bible: A chronological approach from 1 Samuel to Malachi)

Continuing the chronological approach begun in *Studying God's Word: Book E*, this course mostly covers select passages from the books of Samuel and Kings, Daniel, Esther, and Nehemiah, all in forty-six lessons and includes three in-book tests. The text contains required in-book exercises; including three in-book tests and map activities, as well as Bible book outlines and chronological charts. Scripture memory work is optional, but encouraged. The workbook and teacher's manual are published by Christian Liberty Press. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis.

19565 Studying God's Word: Book G Grade 6 \$107.00
(Bible: A chronological approach to the message and ministry of Jesus Christ)

The third book in the *Studying God's Word* chronology series, this course examines the four Gospels and provides a chronological overview of the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. The fifty-six lesson workbook contains required in-book exercises (including four tests), timeline charts, and background outlines on the Gospels. Scripture memory work is optional, but encouraged. The workbook and teacher's manual are published by Christian Liberty Press. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis.

19570 Studying God's Word: Book H Grade 7 \$107.00
(Bible: A chronological approach to the book of Acts)

The final volume in the *Studying God's Word* chronology series, this course covers the book of the Acts of the Apostles. Its forty-three lessons contain lesson and review questions, occasional map exercises, and four self-tests. Supplemental exercises may also be completed when desired. Scripture memory work is optional but encouraged. The workbook and teacher's manual are published by Christian Liberty Press. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis. 1.0 credit if taken at the high school level.

READING

20010 First Grade Reading **Grade 1** **\$136.00**

This course is a combination of phonics and reading materials published by Christian Liberty Press. The primary phonics instruction is found within a 129-page workbook that deals with such topics as short and long vowels, consonants, digraphs, silent letters, syllable division, synonyms, antonyms, and homonyms. Flashcards are included in the back of the teacher's manual and charts are at the back of the student workbook. An additional phonics text is included for extra practice, as well as two reading books. All workbook exercises are required.

20020 Second Grade Reading **Grade 2** **\$135.00**

This course is a combination of phonics and reading materials published by Christian Liberty Press. The primary phonics instruction is found within a workbook which reviews kindergarten and first grade level phonics, and covers such topics as prefixes, suffixes, consonants and consonant blends, digraphs, diphthongs, silent letters, syllable division, synonyms, antonyms, and homonyms. A teacher's manual for the phonics workbook is included. Three reading books are included with the phonics. All workbook exercises are required.

20030 Third Grade Reading **Grade 3** **\$121.00**

This course consists of three readers and one text for the teacher, each published by Christian Liberty Press. The teacher's text is designed to help the instructor take the student beyond phonics instruction to reading proficiency. The student is required to provide written answers to review questions in one of the reading books.

20040 Fourth Grade Reading **Grade 4** **\$116.00**

This course provides the student with three reading books published by Christian Liberty Press. The student is required to provide written answers to review questions for two books, and to complete tests for one of these books. The student is also introduced to the writing of book reports with one of the books.

20050 Fifth Grade Reading **Grade 5** **\$128.00**

As with the Fourth Grade Reading course, the student is assigned three texts, all published by Christian Liberty Press. Two readers require written answers to review questions, one of which also requires the student to complete tests. The student is required to write a book report on the third book.

20060 Sixth Grade Reading **Grade 6** **\$123.00**

This course includes three texts published by Christian Liberty Press. One is a reader about the lives and inventions of significant inventors. The student is required to complete tests and answer review questions for this book. The student is also required to write book reports for the other two books: a biography of John Bunyan and a historical fiction about the Civil War.

20070 Seventh Grade Reading **Grade 7** **\$123.00**

This course includes three texts published by Christian Liberty Press. The student is required to complete tests and answer review questions for a literature book and write book reports for two other books: a biography of J.E.B. Stuart and a historical fiction text regarding British hymns.

20080 Eighth Grade Reading **Grade 8** **\$124.00**

This course includes three texts published by Christian Liberty Press. The student is required to complete tests and answer review questions for a literature book and write book reports for two other books: a biography of Stonewall Jackson and a historical fiction text regarding Reformation hymns.

HANDWRITING

39910 Writing with Diligence **Grade 1** **\$102.00**

This course presents the student with handwriting readiness and handwriting practice exercises using a traditional ball-and-stick handwriting style. The twenty-six letters of the alphabet (both lower and upper cases) are grouped by strokes in ascending level of difficulty for motor coordination development. Typically, a consistent, daily, ten to fifteen-minute lesson is expected. Proper posture and position for handwriting exercises is taught. Instructions for the parent-teacher are included in the workbook and on supplemental pages. The workbook, practice-writing pad, and teacher instruction pages are published by Christian Liberty Press. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis.

39920 Writing with Prayer **Grade 2** **\$102.00**

This course begins with a review of block-and-stick letters before progressing to cursive readiness. Then the bulk of the course teaches a traditional handwriting style of cursive lettering. The letters of the alphabet are organized by stroke groups in ascending level of difficulty for motor coordination development. Typically, a consistent, daily, fifteen to twenty-minute lesson is expected. Proper posture and position for handwriting exercises is taught. Instructions for the parent-teacher are included in the workbook and on supplemental pages. Christian Liberty Press publishes the workbook, practice-writing pad, and teacher instruction pages. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis.

39930 Writing with Grace **Grade 3** **\$102.00**

This course builds on the foundation of cursive letters taught in the previous workbook. Review of the forty most difficult (upper and lower case) cursive letters is included, along with various applications and longer exercises using a traditional cursive handwriting style. Proper posture and position for handwriting exercises is taught. All exercises in the workbook are required. Instructions for the parent-teacher are included in the workbook and on supplemental pages. The workbook, practice-writing pad, and teacher instruction pages are published by Christian Liberty Press. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis.

39940 Writing with Power **Grade 4** **\$102.00**

This course continues the review and practice of previously learned cursive handwriting skills using a traditional cursive handwriting style. Proper posture and position for handwriting exercises is taught. All exercises in the workbook are required. Instructions for the parent-teacher are included in the workbook and on supplemental pages. Christian Liberty Press publishes the workbook, practice-writing pad, and teacher instruction pages. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis.

SPELLING

39610 Building Spelling Skills 1 **Grade 1** **\$104.00**

This course builds a student's spelling ability in thirty-six lessons with the use of phonics rules. The workbook instructs the student to spell with the use of short and long vowel sounds, double consonants, special blends, digraphs *oo* and *or*, diphthongs, word endings, prefixes, suffixes, and compound words. The student is expected to learn twenty words per week. Instructors may need to read directions to the student, at least in the early lessons. The student must complete all the lessons in the book. The workbook is published by Christian Liberty Press. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis.

39620 Building Spelling Skills 2 **Grade 2** **\$107.00**

This course features a review of phonics and spelling patterns from the first book in the series, then goes on to explore a variety of consonant combinations, blends, digraphs, the spelling of certain peculiar phonetic sounds, and larger word parts. In the workbook, the final six of the thirty-six lessons combine reading and phonics. The student is expected to learn twenty words per week, following the study plan on page seven of the workbook and the daily lessons. Some lessons incorporate game-like activities. The student must complete all lessons in the book. The workbook and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

39630 Building Spelling Skills 3 **Grade 3** **\$107.00**

This course includes the grouping of words by various phonetic features, including review material from previous books in the series, and also seeks to build vocabulary. The student learns how to spell with beginning consonant sounds, consonant blends, consonant digraphs, vowel digraphs, and diphthongs. In thirty-six units, the student is expected to learn twenty words per week, following the study plan on page seven of the workbook and the daily lessons. Some lessons incorporate game-like activities. The student must complete all lessons in the book. The workbook and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

39640 Building Spelling Skills 4 **Grade 4** **\$107.00**

This course features the use of spelling guides or rules. The student uses these guides while following the study plan on page seven of the workbook and the daily lessons to grow in spelling skills. Reading is also encouraged as a complement to spelling. Twenty

words per week are studied for thirty-six weeks; the word lists include vocabulary building. The student must complete all lessons in the book. The workbook and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

39650 Building Spelling Skills 5 Grade 5 \$107.00

This course presents groups of words for spelling according to various domains of knowledge. These “world[s] of words” are studied from domains such as world and U.S. geography, astronomy, anatomy, health, law, economics, music, buildings, and animals. The student is expected to learn twenty words per week, following the study plan on page seven of the workbook and the daily lessons. Some lessons incorporate game-like activities. Some units require the student to use a dictionary, atlas, or other standard reference tool. A brief atlas is included in the back of the book. The student must complete all lessons in the book. The workbook and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

39660 Building Spelling Skills 6 Grade 6 \$107.00

This course helps the student better prepare to spell words that have difficult sounds or endings, as well as words which include key Latin, Old English, and Greek derivations. The student is expected to learn twenty words per week, following the study plan on page seven of the workbook and the daily lessons. Many lessons incorporate game-like activities. Extensive use of a dictionary and thesaurus are expected, partly to facilitate vocabulary building. The student must complete all lessons in the book. The workbook and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

39670 Building Spelling Skills 7 Grade 7 \$107.00

This course is dedicated exclusively to word building with prefixes and suffixes. The third lesson of five for a given week exposes the student to more in-depth information about the week’s words. The fourth lesson of the week challenges the student to demonstrate his understanding of the listed words by using them in sentences. The student is expected to learn twenty advanced words per week, following the study plan on page seven of the workbook and the daily lessons. Some lessons incorporate game-like activities. Extensive use of a dictionary is expected, partly to facilitate vocabulary building. The student must complete all lessons in the book. The workbook and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

39680 Building Spelling Skills 8 Grade 8 \$111.00

This course teaches many of the most important root words from foundational languages such as Latin, French, Greek, Spanish, American Indian, and Dutch, in thirty-six lessons. The exercises in the workbook include matching words to their definitions, root words, or origins; and using the words in sentences. The materials include a workbook and an answer key, both published by Christian Liberty Press. The requirements for the course are the completion of the workbook exercises, and the unit tests in the back of the workbook.

LANGUAGE ARTS: GRAMMAR

40220 Language 2 **Grade 2** **\$111.00**

This course incorporates grammar, creative writing, and reading comprehension skills as it introduces the student to the written English language. It addresses such topics as the mastering of basic punctuation; writing of complete sentences; reading and writing short stories; and working with compound words, synonyms, and antonyms. All exercises in the workbook must be completed. The colorful workbook is published by A Beka Book, and the answer key by Christian Liberty Press.

40230 Language 3 **Grade 3** **\$115.00**

This course challenges the student to write complete sentences; learn basic grammar (e.g., punctuation, parts of speech, synonyms, antonyms, and homonyms), write creatively, and use a dictionary. The workbook features a handbook of rules and definitions at the back. Course requirements include daily exercises in the workbook and completion of fifteen tests. The colorful workbook is published by A Beka Book; the tests and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

40245 God's Gift of Language A **Grade 4** **\$117.00**

This course exposes the student to such topics as writing a sentence, writing letters and book reports, using a dictionary and an encyclopedia, capitalization, proper punctuation, and recognizing and using various parts of speech. Sentence diagramming is introduced in this course. Course requirements include daily exercises in the workbook and completion of ten tests. The colorful workbook is published by A Beka Book; the tests and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

40255 God's Gift of Language B **Grade 5** **\$119.00**

This course continues the study of the parts of speech, capitalization, word choice, and punctuation. It also expands the student's exposure to writing by having him write different types of sentences, letters, paragraphs, outlines, and book reports. The student is also taught how to use a dictionary, thesaurus, and encyclopedia. Sentence diagramming is included in this course. Course requirements include daily exercises in the workbook and completion of fourteen tests. A Beka Book publishes the workbook; the answer key and tests are published by Christian Liberty Press.

40265 God's Gift of Language C **Grade 6** **\$118.00**

This course continues the student's review of the parts of speech, capitalization, and punctuation. It also furthers study of the writing process by teaching the student about different types of sentences and the process of writing a research report. Sentence diagramming is included in this course. A student writer's handbook is featured at the back of the workbook. Course requirements include daily exercises in the workbook and completion of twelve tests. The workbook is published by A Beka Book; the tests and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

49615 Applications of Grammar: Book 1 Grade 7 \$116.00
(revised edition)

This course presents grammatical topics such as parts of speech, writing different types of sentences and phrases, punctuation, capitalization, problems related to grammatical agreement, and paragraph writing. Sentence diagramming is included in this course. A glossary of terms is featured in the back of the student workbook. Course requirements include daily exercises in the workbook and completion of eighteen tests. The workbook, tests, and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

49625 Applications of Grammar: Book 2 Grade 8 \$121.00
(revised edition)

This course focuses on reviewing the basics of English grammar. Topics include parts of speech, vocabulary building, diagramming and writing sentences, verb conjugation, subject-verb agreement, using phrases and clauses properly, and the basics of good composition. Course materials include a workbook, a teacher's manual, and tests, all published by Christian Liberty Press. Course requirements include completion of workbook exercises, writing exercises, and twelve tests. 0.5 credit if taken at the high school level.

MATHEMATICS

59510 Liberty Mathematics: Level A Grade 1 \$113.00

This course begins with learning numbers zero through ten, and then progressively exposes the student to addition and subtraction exercises through eighteen, addition and subtraction of two digit numbers (with carrying and borrowing), and place value. It also covers time and money, as well as basic geometry, measurement, and fractions. Course requirements involve completion of workbook exercises. The workbook and teacher's manual are published by Christian Liberty Press.

56320 MCP Mathematics: Level B Grade 2 \$140.00

This course begins by reviewing addition and subtraction facts through eighteen, and then progressively exposes the student to addition and subtraction of two and three digit numbers, and multiplication facts through five times five. Time and money, measurement, geometry, and fractions exercises are also presented. Course requirements involve completion of workbook exercises. The student must show his work for all steps of each problem. The workbook and teacher's guide are published by Modern Curriculum Press.

56330 MCP Mathematics: Level C Grade 3 \$144.00

This course begins by reviewing facts regarding addition, subtraction, and place value; then presents topics such as time, measurement, fractions, geometry and graphing, as well as multiplication and division facts through nine, and an introduction to decimals. A number of word problem sets are included. Course requirements involve completion of daily exercises and fifteen tests. Calculators should only be used when and where the

workbook specifically directs. The student must show his work for all steps of each problem. The workbook and teacher's guide are published by Modern Curriculum Press while the tests are produced by Christian Liberty Press.

56340 MCP Mathematics: Level D **Grade 4** **\$144.00**

This course begins by reviewing facts regarding addition and subtraction and then presents topics such as multiplication of whole numbers, division by a one-digit number and by whole numbers, and working with decimals and fractions. The student is also introduced to measurement, graphing, probability, and geometry. A number of word problem sets are included. Course requirements involve completion of daily exercises and fifteen tests. Calculators should only be used when and where the workbook specifically directs. The student must show his work for all steps of each problem. The workbook and teacher's guide are published by Modern Curriculum Press and the tests are produced by Christian Liberty Press.

56350 MCP Mathematics: Level E **Grade 5** **\$145.00**

This course begins by reviewing facts regarding number and place value and then moves into addition, subtraction, and multiplication of whole numbers, and division by one and two digit numbers. The student will also work with fractions, decimals, ratio, percent, measurement, geometry, polygons, graphs, statistics, and probability. A number of word problem sets are included. Course requirements involve completion of daily exercises and fifteen tests. Calculators should only be used when and where the workbook specifically directs. The student must show his work for all steps of each problem. The workbook and teacher's guide are published by Modern Curriculum Press; the tests are produced by Christian Liberty Press.

56360 MCP Mathematics: Level F **Grade 6** **\$145.00**

This course begins by reviewing and adding topics such as addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division of whole numbers, fractions, and decimals, but also includes topics such as: measurement, geometry, area and volume, ratio and percent, graphs and probability, exponents, and integers. A number of word problem sets are included. Course requirements involve completion of daily exercises and fifteen tests. Calculators should only be used when and where the workbook specifically directs. The student must show his work for all steps of each problem. The workbook and teacher's guide are published by Modern Curriculum Press and the tests are produced by Christian Liberty Press.

59370 Saxon Math 76 (fourth edition) **Grade 7** **\$145.00**

This course uses an incremental approach to topics such as adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing of signed numbers (including fractions and decimals); simplification of expressions containing parentheses; work with exponents, square roots, geometric formulas, and more. The book is comprised of 120 lessons and twelve "Investigation" sections. Course requirements involve completion of problem sets, timed Facts Practice sheets, and twelve exams. The student must show his work for all steps of each problem. Practice tests and an answer key are included as part of the publisher's *Homeschool Packet*. Calculators may only be used when specifically required

to do so by the textbook, and may never be used on the required tests. Saxon Publishers publish the textbook and *Homeschool Packet*; Christian Liberty Press publishes the required exams.

59375 Saxon Algebra $\frac{1}{2}$ (third edition) Grade 8 \$160.00
(Pre-Algebra)

This course bridges the gap from basic math skills to algebraic concepts. Included concepts are evaluation and simplification of algebraic expressions, solving linear equations with one unknown, graphs, statistics, probability, and some geometric calculations. Materials include a textbook and *Homeschool Packet* by Saxon and an exam kit by Christian Liberty Press. Course requirements include completion of the exercises in the textbook problem sets and all ten exams. Prerequisite: Successful completion of seventh grade mathematics with a “C” or better. 1.0 credit if taken at the high school level.

SCIENCE

69510 Our Father’s World Grade 1 \$112.00

This course is designed so that the student has about a twenty-minute science lesson every other day during the normal school year. Science topics covered include day and night, seasons, plants, insects, animals, and people, all considered with reference to the Creator. Course requirements involve study of the colorful workbook, various exercises and activities (including experiments and vocabulary building), and eight tests. The parent-instructor may read the book to her student unless the student is able to read it on his own. The workbook, tests, and teacher’s manual are published by Christian Liberty Press.

69525 God’s Wonderful Works Grade 2 \$114.00

This course approaches a variety of science topics following the pattern of the days of creation in Genesis. The course is designed so that the student has about a twenty-minute science lesson every other day during most of the normal school year. The colorful textbook is published by A Beka Book; the tests and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

60250 Investigating God's World **Grade 5** **\$115.00**

This course covers topics such as scientific method, mammals, light, rocks, minerals, and soil, the sea and sea creatures, energy and engines, astronomy and weather, and vertebrate animals. Activities and experiments enhance student understanding. Course requirements involve completion of written exercises and five tests. 60360 Observing God's World **Grade 6** **\$117.00**

This course covers topics such as insects, crustaceans, worms, plant parts, types of trees, earth's structure, earthquakes, gems and metals, volcanoes, stars, galaxies, light, the moon and our solar system, elements in the periodic table, mass, weight, and density. Activities and experiments enhance student understanding. Course requirements involve completion of written exercises and six tests. 60270 Science: Order and Reality **Grade 7** **\$119.00**

This course covers topics such as pollen, seeds, photosynthesis, human body organs and systems, chemical and physical characteristics of matter, the atmosphere, weather, classification of living things, the cell, creation versus evolution, and insects and arthropods. Activities and experiments enhance student understanding. Course requirements involve completion of written exercises and thirteen tests. HISTORY

79900 History for Little Pilgrims Grade 1 \$113.00

This course begins with God's government of history and then continues with an introductory study of United States history. Course requirements involve completion of written exercises and eight tests. Use of a globe or atlas and other resources is encouraged. The workbook, tests, and teacher's manual are published by Christian Liberty Press.

79835 American Pioneers and Patriots Grade 3 \$107.00

This course presents fictional, but realistic adventure stories of seventeenth-to-nineteenth century pioneer children in America. The text includes special unit studies to teach the student how things were done in the past. Student requirements involve answering comprehension questions and completing twelve tests. The textbook, tests, and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

79945 A Child's Story of America Grade 4 \$109.00

This course provides the student with a comprehensive overview of United States history from Columbus through the late twentieth century. Student requirements involve completion of written exercises and fifteen tests. The textbook, tests, and answer key are published by Christian Liberty Press.

79950 Exploring American History Grade 5 \$105.00

79960 Story of the Middle Ages Grade 6 \$113.00

Among the topics covered are vocabulary; synonyms, antonyms, and homonyms; sentence components and structure; grammar and usage; capitalization and punctuation; basic composition; and study skills. Requirements include completion of the workbook exercises and the six tests in the teacher's guide. 0.5 credit.

MATHEMATICS

59375 Saxon Algebra $\frac{1}{2}$ (third edition) (Pre-Algebra) Grade 8 \$160.00

This course bridges the gap from basic math skills to algebraic concepts. Included concepts are evaluation and simplification of algebraic expressions, solving linear equations with one unknown, graphs, statistics, probability, and some geometric calculations. Materials include a textbook, *Home Study Packet*, and *Solutions Manual* by Saxon plus an exam kit by Christian Liberty Press. Course requirements include completion of the exercises in the textbook problem sets and all ten exams. Prerequisite: Successful completion of seventh grade mathematics with a "C" or better. 1.0 credit if taken at the high school level.

58385 Working with Numbers: Refresher Grade 9 \$121.00

This course provides a thorough review of grade school and junior high math for students who may need to refresh their skill before moving into pre-algebra and more advanced high school math courses. Among the topics covered are basic arithmetic operations with whole numbers; basic arithmetic operations with fractions and mixed numbers; working with decimals and percents; introductory concepts in algebra and

THEOLOGY

12958 Kingdom of God, first half **Grade 9** **\$120.00**
(Old Testament survey)

This course covers the books of Moses (Genesis through Deuteronomy), historical accounts from Joshua to the first part of 2 Kings, and the poetic books Job, Psalms, Proverbs, and Song of Solomon. Textbook chapters (1–24) include historical summaries, various explanations and selected discussions, book outlines, and an occasional chart. Materials include a textbook published by Christian Schools International, as well as eight exams, an exam key, and an answer key published by Christian Liberty Press. Requirements include completion of exams and textbook questions, both of which draw from material in the textbook chapters and selected Old Testament passages. 1.0 credit.

12953 Kingdom of God, second half **Grade 10** **\$120.00**
(Old Testament survey)

This course covers the latter part of 2 Kings, Chronicles, Esther, Ezra, Nehemiah, Ecclesiastes, and the sixteen prophetic books. Textbook chapters (25–48) include historical summaries, various explanations and selected discussions, and book outlines. Materials include the same textbook and answer key used in the first half of the course, as well as the Christian Liberty Press produced eight exams and exam key. Requirements include completion of exams and textbook questions, both of which draw from material in the textbook chapters and selected Old Testament passages. Prerequisite: *Kingdom of God*, first half. 1.0 credit.

19590 The Life of Christ **Grades 11–12** **\$111.00**
(Bible/Theology)

This course provides students with an overview of the earthly ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ, leading up to His crucifixion. It concludes with Christ's resurrection and ascension and their implications for the lives of both believers and unbelievers. Materials include a textbook, six tests, and an answer key, published by Christian Liberty Press. Students are required to complete textbook exercises and the six tests. 1.0 credit.

19595 The Book of Job Unfolded **Grades 11–12** **\$120.00**
(Bible: Job)

Students begin by reading the biblical book of Job. The textbook itself unfolds this Bible story in summary fashion, interwoven with the author's commentary and pastoral exhortation and encouragement. A student book and a parent-teacher answer key, published by Christian Liberty Press, are provided. Students are responsible to answer all questions, which follow each of the ten textbook chapters. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis. 1.0 credit.

10090 Manual of Christian Doctrine **Grades 11–12** **\$120.00**
(Advanced Theology)

Author Louis Berkhof has distilled his major work *Systematic Theology* into a shorter manual for use by younger students. The doctrines of Revelation, God (being and works), Man, Christ, Redemption, the Church, and Last Things are covered in outline form from a Reformed perspective, with selected alternative views sometimes presented. Materials include a textbook published by Christian Liberty Press. Students must answer in-book questions. Prerequisite: familiarity with the Bible. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis. 1.0 credit.

17110 Every Thought Captive **Grades 11–12** **\$106.00**
(Advanced Theology, Apologetics)

In this course, the student learns the structure and method for defending his faith in Jesus Christ and for evangelizing his neighbor. Such apologetics is accomplished by both presenting the biblical worldview, with evidence, and by using the non-Christian's view against him. The student is required to answer all chapter review questions. A student textbook is provided, published by Presbyterian and Reformed Publishing Company. This course is graded on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis. 1.0 credit.

19695 Calvinism, Hyper-Calvinism, and **Grades 11–12** **\$112.00**
Arminianism (Advanced Theology)

In this course, the authors seek to protect the church against damaging doctrines. Traditional Calvinism is explained and defended, and Hyper-Calvinism and Arminianism are refuted in subjects such as: the sovereignty of God, the atonement of Christ, and the perseverance of the saints. Lists of Scripture texts are cited which are relevant to each topic. Students are required to answer in-book questions. A textbook and an answer key, published by Christian Liberty Press, are provided. 1.0 credit.

19190 By This Standard (Advanced Theology) Grade 12 \$106.00

This course deals with the authority of God's Law today. It covers the basic outline of the New Testament's case for the continuing validity of Old Testament law. Materials include a book written by Dr. Greg Bahnsen (published by the Institute for Christian Economics). Students are required to complete a summary report about the book of approximately 2,500–3,000 words. 1.0 credit.

LITERATURE

29695 Exploring Christian Literature Grade 9 \$112.00

This course features classic American and English literature in a variety of short stories, biographies, prose, plays, and poems. The text covers such themes as charity and industry, courage and humility, faith, family, justice, and heaven. It includes selections by such authors as Shakespeare, Tolstoy, Tennyson, Edwards, Milton, and Machen. Biblically oriented comprehension questions are presented at the end of selected works. Materials include a textbook, test packet, and a key for both text comprehension questions and eight tests, all published by Christian Liberty Press. Course requirements involve reading the entire text and completing the accompanying eight tests. 0.5 credit.

20225 World Literature (third edition) Grades 10–12 \$125.00

This course presents a background to the study of world literature featuring the use of short story, essay, and narrative and descriptive poetry. Each reading selection includes author biographical information and questions to encourage thoughtful interaction and Christian character development. The textbook introduces the meaning and use of such literary terms and forms as character development, narrative poetry, plot, imagery and figurative language, theme, rhyme and rhythm, emotion, poetry patterns and forms, paradox, and setting. The course features classic literary works by such authors as Dickens, Browning, Frost, Holmes, Tennyson, Poe, Doyle, Keats, and Cummings. Masterpieces of art are introduced and parallel the theme of each of the literary units. Materials include a textbook published by A Beka Book, as well as a teacher's manual, test key, and test packet published by Christian Liberty Press. Course Requirements involve reading the entire text and completing the accompanying four comprehensive tests. 0.5 credit.

20250 The Literature of the American People Grades 11–12 \$125.00

This course provides a chronological study of nineteenth and twentieth century American literature. It covers the three literary periods known as the Romantic, Realistic, and Modern, giving their historical backgrounds, writing techniques, and philosophies of the writers. Literary devices learned in *World Literature* are reviewed and new ones are introduced. Selected readings are from well-known American authors, poets, preachers, hymn writers, statesmen, and Bible scholars. Masterpieces of American art reflecting the spirit of the times are incorporated into each unit of the textbook. Materials include a textbook published by A Beka Book, as well as a teacher's manual

and a test packet published by Christian Liberty Press. Course requirements involve reading the entire text and completing the accompanying three comprehensive tests. Prerequisite: A high school-level literature course that teaches and applies literary terms and devices. 0.5 credit.

20260 Introduction to English Literature **Grades 11–12** **\$125.00**

This course examines classic literary works from the early English: Anglo-Saxon, Medieval, Elizabethan, and Puritan Ages (approximately 449–1660 AD). Chaucer, Spenser, Shakespeare, Bacon, Milton, and Bunyan are just a few of the English authors featured in the course text. English portraits, scenic photographs, paintings, and art objects are included in the units to enhance the literary selections. Background material, author biographies, histories of each period and language, and literary terminology are provided. Materials include a textbook published by A Beka Book, as well as a teacher’s manual and a test packet published by Christian Liberty Press. Course requirements involve reading the entire text and completing the accompanying three comprehensive tests. Prerequisite: A high school-level literature course that teaches and applies literary terms and devices. 0.5 credit.

LANGUAGE ARTS: GRAMMAR AND ENGLISH

49635 Applications of Grammar: Book 3 (revised edition) **Grade 9** **\$121.00**

In this course, the student will study parts of speech, writing mechanics and style, sentence structure, and clause types. In addition, the student will begin to learn how to apply these elements by composing short stories and essays of various types. The course also introduces the student to the basics of developing a writing style as well as journalistic and figurative writing. Materials include a workbook, a teacher’s manual, and ten tests, all published by Christian Liberty Press. Students are required to complete all tests as well as workbook and composition exercises. Prerequisite: *Applications of Grammar Book Two* (or equivalent). 0.5 credit.

49645 Applications of Grammar: Book 4 (revised edition) **Grade 10** **\$113.00**

Applications of Grammar: Book 4 is designed as a review of the basic elements of effective writing and a reinforcement of the fundamentals of grammar. This course is essentially divided in two parts—composition and grammar. The first part emphasizes the thinking process and develops a sound writing strategy. These basic elements of effective writing are then applied to writing an essay, a research paper, and an article of opinion. The second part focuses on grammar, highlighting various grammatical issues that are challenging or prone to errors. Materials include a workbook, teacher’s manual, and fifteen tests, all published by Christian Liberty Press. Students are required to complete the workbook exercises and all tests. Prerequisite: *Applications of Grammar: Book 3* (or equivalent). 0.75 credit

49650 Applications of Grammar Grade 11 \$121.00
Book Five

This course emphasizes the advanced principles of grammar and creative writing as well as vocabulary and spelling development. Students will study compound and concrete nouns; abstract and collective nouns; subject-verb agreement, transitive and intransitive verbs; subordinating conjunctions; adverbial, adjective, and elliptical clauses; appositives; and tense, voice, and mood of verbs. Students will apply these concepts in the composition of various types of paragraphs and a research paper. Materials include a workbook, teacher's manual, and eight tests, all published by Christian Liberty Press. Requirements include completion of the workbook exercises, composition projects, and tests. Prerequisite: *Applications of Grammar Book Four* (or equivalent). 0.5 credit.

49660 Applications of Grammar Grade 12 \$121.00
Book Six

This course provides continued training in the advanced principles of grammar, punctuation, and composition, in addition to vocabulary and spelling development. Students will study participial phrases; gerunds; infinitives; various types of clauses; compound sentences; conjunctive adverbs; reflexive, intensive, and indefinite pronouns; grammatical agreement; voice, tense, mood, and conjugation of verbs; and figurative language. Composition projects teach students how to write narrative, descriptive, and argumentative paragraphs, and how to outline and write an essay. Materials include a workbook, teacher's manual, and sixteen tests, all published by Christian Liberty Press. Course requirements include completion of textbook exercises, composition projects, and tests. Prerequisite: *Applications of Grammar Book Five* (or equivalent). 0.5 credit.

40910 English 9 Grade 9 \$136.00

The student will be assigned one grammar workbook and three books. The student is required to finish all exercises in the workbook, some of which are composition assignments which must be completed on separate paper, and complete all grammar tests. Book reports must be written for each of the three books—a biography of David Livingstone, a book about the Pilgrims, and a work of fiction regarding American hymns. All course materials are published by Christian Liberty Press. 1.0 credit.

40920 English 10 Grade 10 \$127.00

The student will be assigned one grammar workbook which includes instructions on how to write a research paper, and two books. The student is required to finish all in-book grammar exercises, complete all grammar tests, and write a research paper using the guidelines provided. Book reports must be written for each of two books—a biography of George McClellan and an economics reader. All course materials are published by Christian Liberty Press. 1.0 credit.

40930 English 11 Grade 11 \$128.00

This course consists of one grammar workbook and two books. The student is required to finish all exercises in the workbook, including the research paper assignment which

must be completed on separate paper, and complete all grammar tests. Book reports must be written for each of two books—a biography of Martin Luther and an economics reader. All course materials are published by Christian Liberty Press. 1.0 credit.

40940 English 12 **Grade 12** **\$139.00**

The student will be assigned one grammar workbook, one book explaining how to write a research paper, and two books. The student is required to finish all in-book grammar exercises and complete all grammar tests. Book reports must be written for each of the two books—a biography of Charles Spurgeon and an historical fiction work. The student must also complete a research paper using the guidelines in the research paper text. All course materials are published by Christian Liberty Press. 1.0 credit.

LANGUAGE ARTS:

WRITTEN AND VERBAL COMMUNICATION

42305 Speech for Christian Schools **Grades 9–12** **\$131.00**

This course offers an examination of the forms, methods, and situations of public speaking. The speeches that are covered are an informative speech, a persuasive speech, a eulogy, an acceptance speech, and a devotional speech. There is also a section on drama. The materials include one textbook, published by Bob Jones University Press. The requirements for the course include the questions at the end of each chapter, and five speeches to be presented orally to the instructor. 1.0 credit.

49140 Format Writing **Grades 9–12** **\$115.00**

This course emphasizes the technical aspects of how to construct good paragraphs, essays, and research papers. The assignments in the book include writing seven kinds of paragraphs and seven kinds of essays, as well as a research paper. Materials include a workbook, published by Wordsmiths. Requirements of the course include completing the writing assignments that are found in the workbook, as well as some in-book exercises. 1.0 credit.

49910 The Exciting World of Creative Writing (Creative Writing 1) **Grades 9–12** **\$109.00**

This course emphasizes creativity in writing. Students will learn how to write short stories, both fictional and non-fictional. Students will also receive information and guidance about getting their stories published. The materials include one workbook, tests, and a test key, all published by Christian Liberty Press. The required work for this course includes completion of both the tests and several different types of creative writing assignments. 0.5 credit.

41110 Success in Writing 1 (Creative Writing 2) **Grades 9–12** **\$105.00**

This course presents a balanced approach to both the technical and creative aspects of writing. Many sections contain samples of good writing from literature, providing

60395 Chemistry: Precision and Design Grades 11–12 \$167.00

This course explores a wide range of topics related to the chemistry field, all based on biblical principals. Topics include elements and compounds, chemical reactions, chemical thermodynamics, structure of atom, the periodic table, intermolecular forces, metals, nonmetals, chemical kinetics, chemical equilibrium, acids, bases, oxidation, and nuclear chemistry. Materials include a textbook, a test kit, and a textbook solution manual—all published by A Beka Book. Students are required to complete twelve tests as well as exercises in the textbook. Prerequisite: Algebra 1 with a final grade of “C” or better. 1.0 credit.

60295 Physics: The Foundational Science Grades 11–12 \$167.00

This course introduces basic physics concepts. Coursework examines fundamental laws of matter and energy, velocity and acceleration, thermodynamics and heat, acoustics and sound waves, reflection and refraction of light, electricity, magnetism, and quantum theory. Materials include a textbook, the test kit, and a textbook solution manual—all published by A Beka Book. Students are required to complete eleven tests as well as the exercises in the textbook. Prerequisite: Algebra 2 with a final grade of “C” or better. 1.0 credit.



69590 Introduction to the Engineering Profession (Engineering) Grades 10–12 \$235.00

This course will give students a clear understanding of the multifaceted field of engineering, enabling them to decide if they wish to pursue an engineering career. Materials include a textbook, a set of three CD-ROMs containing lectures related to the textbook and interviews with various engineers, a teacher’s guide, and a test booklet. Students are required to complete textbook exercises, chapter quizzes, and tests. The student text is published by HarperCollins College Publishers; all other materials, by Christian Liberty Press. Prerequisite: Algebra 1 with a final grade of “B” or better, and access to a computer with a spreadsheet program. System Requirements: PC with a Pentium 300 MHz or higher processor, minimum 32 MB RAM (64 MB recommended), Windows 98, SE, ME, 2000, or XP, 16x CD-ROM, sound card with speakers. 1.0 credit.

69595 Lift Up Your Eyes on High (Astronomy) Grades 9–12 \$121.00

This course helps students understand the stars from a Christian perspective. It points to God’s control over and plan for the stars as part of His creation. Materials include a textbook, teacher’s manual, and six tests—all published by Christian Liberty Press. Students are required to complete the textbook exercises and the tests. 1.0 credit.

69130 Exploring the History of Medicine (Medical Science) Grades 9–10 \$113.00

This course reveals the history behind the most significant medical advances from ancient to modern times from a biblical perspective. As part of this study, students will learn about many of the key medical scientists in history. Materials include one textbook, published by Master Books. Students are required to complete the textbook exercises. 1.0 credit.

67110 Fossils that Speak Out (Creation Science) Grades 9–12 \$106.00

This course examines some of the evidence that supports the Biblical creation model. It documents much of the fraud that has been perpetuated by “science” in order to further the theory of evolution. Materials include one textbook, published by Presbyterian & Reformed Publishing. Requirements for the course include writing a summary of the book. 0.5 credit.

HISTORY

79555 Streams of Civilization: Volume 1 (World History: Creation to 1620s) Grade 9 \$128.00

This course provides a comprehensive overview of world history from the beginning of time until the Reformation. It takes a creationist perspective when dealing with anthropology, archaeology, and the origin of man. Materials include a textbook, teacher’s manual, test key, and seventeen tests—all published by Christian Liberty Press. Students are required to complete chapter tests. In addition, extensive vocabulary words and suggested projects are included in the text for use as supplemental activities. 1.0 credit.

79560 Streams of Civilization: Volume 2 (World History: 1500s to 2000) Grade 10 \$128.00

This course examines modern world history from a Christian viewpoint. It deals with such issues as Western exploration and colonialism, Reformation and Counter-Reformation, revolution, economic progress, world wars, and the rise of the Third World. Materials include a textbook, answer key, and seventeen tests—all published by Christian Liberty Press. Students are required to complete textbook exercises and chapter tests. 1.0 credit.

72383 U.S. History for Christian Schools, 1st half (U.S. History: Colonial period to 1850) Grades 11–12 \$134.00

This course provides students with a study of early American history from a Christian perspective: from exploration of the New World through the Mexican War. It also includes a study of the Consitution and select Federalist papers. Materials include a textbook (published by Bob Jones University Press), as well as an answer key and fourteen tests, both published by Christian Liberty Press. Students are required to complete exercises for chapters 1–12 and the two appendicies, as well as the related tests. 1.0 credit.

72385 U.S. History for Christian Schools, 2nd half (U.S. History: Civil War to the 2000s) Grades 11–12 \$134.00

This course follows *U.S. History for Christian Schools*, first half and provides students with a thorough study of modern American history from a Christian perspective. It examines the key events of the 19th and 20th centuries. Materials include the same textbook and answer key used in the first half of the course, in addition to fifteen Christian Liberty Press produced tests. Students are required to complete textbook

exercises for chapters 13–27 and chapter tests. Prerequisite: Completion of *U.S. History for Christian Schools*, first half (or equivalent). 1.0 credit.

79195 Church History in Plain Language **Grades 11–12** **\$111.00**
(Church History)

This course covers the broad scope of church history, beginning with the apostolic era and continuing through to the end of the twentieth century. Materials include a textbook written by Dr. Bruce Shelley (published by Word Publishing). Students are required to complete written summaries of the chapters within the book. 1.0 credit.

GOVERNMENT AND ECONOMICS

71710 God and Government: Volume 1 **Grade 10** **\$113.00**
(Government)

This course is a study of the biblical teachings regarding civil government, and a review of the American system of government on the basis of such principles. Materials include a textbook by Gary DeMar, a test key, and eleven tests. Students are required to complete textbook exercises and chapter tests. The student text is published by American Vision; Christian Liberty Press publishes the tests and test key. 1.0 credit.

71715 God and Government: Volume 2 **Grade 11** **\$113.00**
(Government)

This course introduces the concept of worldview to students and then applies it to such issues as sovereignty, economics, and poverty. Materials include a textbook by Gary DeMar, a test key, and ten tests. Students are required to complete textbook exercises and chapter tests. The student text is published by American Vision; the tests and test key are published by Christian Liberty Press. 1.0 credit.

71720 God and Government: Volume 3 **Grades 11–12** **\$110.00**
(Government)

This course teaches that God is sovereign over the nations and that He has provided, in the Bible, the foundation for law. It then applies this foundation to such topics as justice, human rights, education, and the future of government. Materials include a textbook by Gary DeMar (published by American Vision). Students are required to complete textbook exercises. 1.0 credit.

79190 Constitutional Law for Christian **Grades 11–12** **\$135.00**
Students (Constitutional Law)

This course examines the historical background of the United States Constitution, as well as key decisions of the Supreme Court. The author examines constitutional history from the perspective of the original intent of the Framers of the Constitution. Materials include a textbook and teacher handbook, both written by Michael Farris and published by the Home School Legal Defense Association. Students are required to complete textbook questions. Prerequisite: Completion of a survey course on the United States Constitution, such as *The Story of the Constitution*. 1.0 credit.

70195 Economics: Work and Prosperity (Economics) Grade 12 \$127.00

This course provides a solid overview of economic theory from a Christian perspective. It gives a biblical view of work, wealth, and stewardship, contrasting the free market with the Communist economic system. Materials include a textbook originally written by Russell Kirk, an answer key, and seven exams. Students are required to complete the chapter review exercises and the exams. The textbook is published by A Beka Book; the answer key and exams, by Christian Liberty Press. 1.0 credit.

PHILOSOPHY, SOCIOLOGY, AND FAMILY LIFE

19150 The Voice of Authority (Philosophy) Grades 11–12 \$105.00

This course examines the question of who sets the standard in matters of truth and conduct: man or God. Materials include a textbook, published by Ross House Books. Students are required to complete a summary report of approximately 1,500 words about the book. 0.5 credit.

80065 Liberating Planet Earth (Sociology) Grades 11–12 \$105.00

This course addresses the issues of oppression, injustice, and abject need. It contrasts the answers provided by Marxism, Communism, Liberation Theology, and New Age Humanism with those presented in the Bible. Materials include a textbook written by Dr. Gary North (published by Dominion Press) and a study guide (published by the Institute for Christian Economics). Students are required to complete the exercises found within the study guide. 0.5 credit.

77185 Christian Living in the Home (Family Life) Grades 9–12 \$110.00

This course provides an examination of Christ-centered family life. It provides biblically based counsel on husband-wife and parent-child relationships. Materials include one textbook (published by Presbyterian & Reformed Publishing), and four tests (published by Christian Liberty Press). Requirements for the course include completing a summary of the book, as well as the tests. 0.5 credit.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

93330 Living Language Spanish (Spanish 1) Grades 9–12 \$125.00

This is a beginning course in conversational Spanish, which uses the natural method of learning: hear it, say it, absorb it. Topics are organized into concise, short lessons. The course includes a brief summary of grammar, as well as vocabulary helps and a common usage dictionary containing the most common words, with their meanings illustrated in sentences. At the conclusion of the course, the student should display

sufficient conversational command of the language for common practical life situations. Materials include two cassette tapes, a corresponding conversation manual, and a dictionary, all published by Random House. Requirements include completion of all the quiz sections in the manual. 1.0 credit.



93550 Secondary Spanish (Spanish 2) Grades 9-12 \$154.00

This course introduces reading, writing, and listening to students by “placing” them in a variety of Spanish settings. These settings create the opportunity to learn Spanish by speaking and writing about different situations and contexts. The box set includes a Switched on Schoolhouse reference guide and CD-ROM, as well as a CD-ROM containing the Spanish lessons, assignments, activities, and dictionary. All materials are published by Alpha Omega. Requirements include completion of all exercises and lessons on the CD-ROM. System requirements: PC with a Pentium 400 MHz or higher processor; minimum 128 MB RAM; 200 MB hard disk space; Windows 98, SE, ME, 2000, or XP; 4x CD-ROM; sound card with speakers; 16-bit color; and 1024x768 or higher resolution. Also recommended: modem, Internet access, and printer. 1.0 credit.

93310 Living Language French (French 1) Grades 9-12 \$125.00

This is a beginning course in conversational French, which uses the natural method of learning: hear it, say it, absorb it. Topics are organized into concise, short lessons. The course includes a brief summary of grammar, as well as supplementary aids such as vocabulary helps and a common usage dictionary containing the most common words, with their meanings illustrated in sentences. System requirements: PC with a Pentium 400 MHz or higher processor; minimum 128 MB RAM; 200 MB hard disk space; Windows 98, SE, ME, 2000, or XP; 4x CD-ROM; sound card with speakers; 16-bit color; and 1024x768 or higher resolution. Also recommended: modem, Internet access, and printer. 1.0 credit.

93320 Living Language German (German 1) Grades 9-12 \$125.00

This is a beginning course in conversational German, which uses the natural method of learning: hear it, say it, absorb it. Topics are organized into concise, short lessons. The

course includes a brief summary of grammar, as well as supplementary aids such as vocabulary helps and a common usage dictionary containing the most common words, with their meanings illustrated in sentences. Students will learn how to translate from Latin into English and from English into Latin. Students will also read selected passages from classical Latin literature. Requirements include completion textbook and workbook exercises for chapters 1–20 plus chapter quizzes and tests. Course materials include a textbook and a workbook published by HarperCollins, as well as a course guide, quiz and test packet, and a quiz and test key printed by Christian Liberty Press. 1.0 credit.

99375 Wheelock’s Latin, 2nd half (Latin 2) Grades 11–12 \$140.00

This course follows *Wheelock’s Latin*, first half and continues the in-depth study of classical Latin in a traditional textbook/workbook approach. Requirements include completion textbook and workbook exercises for chapters 21–40 plus chapter quizzes and tests. Course materials include the same textbook, workbook, course guide, and quiz and test key used in the first half of the course, in addition to twenty Christian Liberty Press produced quizzes and tests. Prerequisite: Completion of *Wheelock’s Latin*, first half (or equivalent). 1.0 credit.

VOCATIONAL

93520 Home Economics: Cooking Grades 9–12 \$123.00

In this course, the student will study the basic science of cooking. Topics include nutrition, food preparation, meal planning, food service, utensils, recipes, and meal management. Hands-on work is required. Materials include two workbooks, one key, and one supplemental booklet (all published by Alpha-Omega), and one workbook published by Christian Liberty Press. Students are required to complete the workbook exercises and two tests that are found in the workbooks. 0.5 credit.

93510 Home Economics: Sewing Grades 9–12 \$123.00

This course studies the basic techniques and materials of sewing, including buttons, seams, zippers, and the use of a sewing machine. Hands-on work is required. Materials include two workbooks and a key for the workbook exercises, each published by Alpha-Omega. Requirements for the course include completing the workbook exercises and two tests that are found in the workbooks. 0.5 credit.

99130 Typing for Beginners (Personal Typing) Grades 9-12 \$115.00

This course is a basic study of the mechanics of typing. The daily work exercises include timed typing, re-typing of letters, and exercises that help increase typing speed. Materials include one textbook, published by Perigee Books. Students are required to complete the textbook exercises. 0.5 credit.

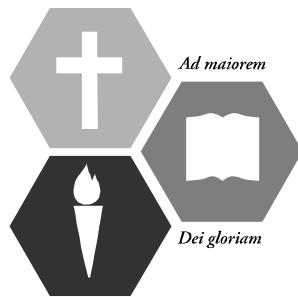


93530 Computer Literacy 1: Windows, Word, and Excel Grades 9-12 \$144.00

Students are required to complete the six LIFEPAKs and the six tests. All printed materials—six workbooks and three answer keys—are published by Alpha-Omega. The three CD-ROMs are produced by Individual Software, Inc. System Requirements: PC with a Pentium or higher processor; minimum 16 MB RAM; 6 MB hard disk space; Windows 95, 98, 2000, or NT; 2x CD-ROM; 256 color VGA or higher display; and sound card with speakers and/or headphones. 1.0 credit.

95110 Beginning Woodwork Grades 9-12 \$175.00

This course is a basic study of carpentry. It includes a review of the tools and techniques used in carpentry, as well as a thorough overview of the processes that are used on lumber today. Questions are included in each chapter. Hands-on work is required. Materials include a textbook, a teachers guide, and a student guide, all published by Glencoe. Requirements for the course include completing exercises found in the student guide, as well as completing a woodworking project. 1.0 credit.
